Service Initiatives

Quality Initiatives

Meditech 6.15 is here! Much thanks goes out to all of you who assisted us all to make this transition as smooth as possible. This upgrade has made significant enhancements to our system including a new Critical Care Flowsheet, the Philips Monitor Interface with Meditech (vital signs), IV infusions/Titrations in MAR with cumulative intakes and a Manage Transfer flag visible in Current Orders. As expected with this big change, there were some unexpected work flow and documentation issues. Thank you for your patience as we continue to work through these changes to perfect our systems.






Thank you to Jesse Magallon for the new **S**trategic **H**ospital **E**mergency

We want to thank Jesse so much for this great idea to provide education to our staff!! This is just one example of what a great staff we have in the ED.



Exceptional response by Dr. Mark Klein and our ICU/OR Staff

We had one of those rare clinical events of a patient going into Malignant Hyperthermia (MH). First of all, Kudos to Dr. Mark Klein for prompt recognition and for his ongoing direction and support of the team. The ICU and OR staff responded to what was identified as an MH event following intubation with succinylcholine. The staff response was like a well-oiled machine and they all worked well together. Sandy Samoske, the educator from Peri-op, stated, "The team members contributed ideas/suggestions for treatment and soldiered on with equanimity in the face of physiology that did not want to respond immediately to treatment." The team successfully administered 40 vials of Dantrolene in 30 minutes with the outcome of reducing the patient's temperature from 40.7 to 38 degrees C.

This was an impressive accomplishment. Thank you to all of our physicians, educators, specialists, nurses, pharmacists and techs, anesthesiologists, runners, all those that participated to help accomplish this timely treatment.
